**Newly-developed Multifunctional Banknote Changer, the EN-700 Series,  
for Financial and Retail & Transportation Markets  
- “Stress-free” money changer with focus on user-friendliness -**

GLORY has developed the EN-700 series banknote changer to be released on October 1, 2011. The EN-700 can facilitate the money changing operations in the financial and retail & transportation markets.

**Main features:**

- Supports the “Universal Design” concept. (Certified as a color universal design\*2 (CUD) product, using the Universal Design (UD) font\*3.)
- Provides a fully-automatic examination function of cash in the machine, the first of its kind in the industry. (Installed in the dispensing blocks for banknotes, rolled coins and loose coins.)
- Provides an easy cash loading function enabling replenishment operations without stopping the machine. (See Note \*1.)
- Dispenses up to six kinds of banknotes including crisp and used banknotes. (Example of banknote combination: 5k, 1k, crisp 10k, crisp 5k, crisp 1k and 2k-yen banknotes)

In recent years, it has become normal for financial institutions to charge customers some fee for money changing service. Because money-changing machines can not only alleviate the burden borne by bank tellers, but also be configured to collect a fee, many financial institutions have been installing such machines. In the retail & transportation markets, they are also used by commercial facilities such as department stores, shopping malls and station buildings as a convenient device to get small changes for cashiers speedily.

The EN-700 series banknote changer has been newly developed in pursuit of a stress-free machine that is friendly for both users and operators.

For end-users, the EN-700 has been developed on the universal design concept for stress-free operation. It has received the Color Universal Design (CUD) certification and adopted the UD font with consideration for persons with color vision deficiency and senior citizens. By conducting a usability test in the development phase, the user friendliness was verified and possible problems were sorted out to create a better product.

For operators, the following functions have been added for better efficiency and stricter cash management by reducing the chance of human intervention;

- A function to count and load cash that makes it possible to automatically load and replenish cash in the machine while they are being counted.
- A function to automatically examine cash amount in the machine. (First in the money changer industry)
- A function which enables cash replenishment from the rear even while the machine is being used, providing

nonstop operation without keeping users/operators waiting.

-A function to dispense up to six kinds of banknotes, making it possible to dispense both crisp and used banknotes in a machine.

In the near future, GLORY will develop a system that can remotely check the amount of cash by denominations remaining in a money changer, by connecting it via network with GLORY's information processing center (GCAN Center (See Note \*4.)). It is expected that this new function will improve efficient use of money prepared for money changers.

GLORY will further improve the usability of the EN-700 series money changer so that it can contribute to increasing efficiency of money changing operation and stricter cash management in various and extensive business applications.

Note \*1 Easy cash loading function:

This function is available only for rear access machines with a dispensing unit (optional).

Note \*2 Color Universal Design (CUD) certification:

The Color Universal Design (CUD) certification is given by the Color Universal Design Organization, a nonprofit organization. This certification is awarded to machines that are easily understandable to many people without being affected by individual difference in color vision.

Note \*3 UD font:

The UD font was developed from the viewpoint of universal design and features a high level of legibility and readability. It is a reader-friendly font. The "Iwata UD font" is a registered trademark of Iwata Corporation.

Note \*4 GCAN Center:

The abbreviation of "Glory Card And Network"
